An Update from the TLC Board

Thanks so much for all your care and support over the past year! And what a year it's been! The challenges that befell so many and the increased need for support was met with enthusiasm and care by Theresa Living Center.

By April of 2020, when it became clear that the pandemic wasn't going away anytime soon, TLC stepped up and covered 100% of the monthly rent for its clients in outside rental housing and suspended the monthly rent for the Residential program. This added commitment of approximately \$10,000

per month guaranteed the housing security of all our clients at a time when the economy was slipping into recession and jobs were disappearing rapidly. TLC's commitment to the community, in the form of rental assistance, increased 32% in 2020 from \$154,000 to \$203,000. It was your donations that made that possible!

The TLC residential program prepared and weathered the pandemic with little to no impact to the residents. Attention to hygiene and ensuring that residents were following protocols put in place ensured that the residential clients remained safe and healthy. Strong leadership by Lucy and the staff resulted in these excellent outcomes!

Finally, the addition of two staff in early 2021, Assistant to the Director Briana Barnes, and Case Manager Jane Morgan, have both made a tremendous impact to the day to day operations of TLC. Welcome Briana and Jane, your commitment to TLC and benefit to our clients is already being felt!

LETTER FROM LUCY: Sankofa Moments



Dear Friends,

We are halfway through 2021, and I can't help but think of the things that have transpired this past year. We've had some pretty defining moments at Theresa Living Center. The rich history of my culture describes defining moments as "Sankofa Moments" – which I

loosely define as the wisdom gained in learning from the past, which ensures a strong future.

In my faith belief, I think about how a called people were told to move into a land of plenty, but as you move forward remember to always tell your children of the past so that they would remember in tough times that there will be provision for them.

In a very defining moment for me at Theresa Living Center, I think of how all of the sponsored ministries of our founding "Sisters" of the School Sisters of Notre Dame were called together in Elk Grove Wisconsin, and we were told how the School Sisters were introduced to work here in the United States. The most indelible defining moment for me was how Sister M. Caroline Friess came to America to establish schools and was faced with the task to raise \$25,000 by a certain day or else the operation would be shut down.

I recall a board meeting where a decision was to be made on keeping our transitional housing program open after all state and federal funding was gone because "transitional housing" was not the way to go for program success. At the meeting, we had a plan to fundraise and look for sponsorship to the tune of \$25,000. Well just like Sister Caroline Friess was given that task; a mysterious donor came through.

My defining "Sankofa Moment" that I speak loudly to the families we serve is to remember or think on the wisdom gained from your past moments of defeat, to move wisely into a strong future. The past year alone had many families wondering if they would ever flourish. I say it was an experience that will allow you to move forward with the wisdom gained into a strong future.
